# 1. Minutes/Agenda

- July minutes: Approved

# 2. Presidents Report:

- Focus of July meeting was PBP where: the 5 pack series was useful, we had a few new people.
- PBP had communication issues as telus was down. Emails were slow or didn't make it. The picture was a success. PBP went well. No lasting injuries. Weather was good, but DNF rate high.
- Tuesdays Province and Sun had a very good article about Deirdre, written by Keith Fraser.
- Group hotel good, thanks to Etienne.
- Colin went to Randonneur Mondial meeting. Can see why they want us to make a national body. Nothing contentious, some by-laws and rule clarifications. Mark Thomas (from Seattle) is new president for 4 years. In 2017, 60 member countries. There are 25 - 1200 events.
  Volunteer burnout is a common theme for 1200's.
- New Challenge award: (Lappernell) Do a 1200 or more in each of 4 consecutive years with start in at least 2 different countries. Starting with PBP.
- Award for series in a different continent.

## 3. Treasurers Report:

- Jacques will prepare 2 years of reports for the AGM.
- Term deposit for Harold Bridge Award is up, need to re-invest. Etienne received notice of this. *Action*: Etienne to send Jacques a comment about this.
- Discussion about Award for Jaquetta.

### 4. Ride Report:

- Nigel: Russel has pre-ridden the 200.
- Jeff still working on route for 200 in October
- Craig will do Nov 11th ride.

- Wim: one more 200 this weekend working on next years schedule.
- Bob: (voice of PBP video) super 600 new route approved: Okanagan super 600 ski touring.
- Bob would like to do interior 1000 on labour day weekend, other rides usual spots.
- Etienne also created a super 600.
- Marc: Good reports on fall 200. 2 routes ready for Nov 11, depending on weather.

## 5. Risk management update:

- Cycling BC Insurance: Background: insurance is not agiven. We had trouble getting it one year, and had to switch. Thinking now to next year. Cycling BC insurance is cheaper, but have to join Cycling BC and all our members have to be members. Last year our total insurance was about \$4800. (We use same provider as cycling BC, same policies) We will save about \$1500 a year, but it costs \$175 for the club to join cycling BC, and for no additional fee be covered. But every ride we do has to be registered in advance. Could still add permanents with 24hour notice. Fee schedule for Populaires, bottom line is using their formulas, an additional \$2600. Membership will be \$60 annually. A one day licence is \$10.
- The question is, do we want to do that. Advantage is advertising. Populaires are how we make money. We have been absorbing the membership and CCN fee in the Populaire. The dilemma is the pushback from patrons when they get charged more if they pay the fee.
- What are advantages to members to be with Cycling BC?
- Discussion about advantages and disadvantages of joining Cycling BC. From a membership benefits and overall cost point of view.
- Motion from Stephen: Anyone in favor rise your hand: no hands raised, as yet.
- Cheryl: Needs more looking into. Talk to other provinces: why are some provinces doing it? eg: some clubs are too small to do it on their own, so they join the provincial organization.
- Suggest: Ask people to let us know if they are a cycling BC member or not.
- Stephen: Question: Could we have 2 categories of membership: riding and non-riding: are we covered for volunteers if they don't get a cycling BC membership.
- Commend Gary for his efforts and bringing us the information.

## 6. Harold Bridge Award:

- Criteria on website and in newsletter. The Bridge family wanted the award to be self sustaining, but interest rates are not enough to maintain it. We can reduce the value of the bursary to make it self sustaining or do top ups.
- **Action**: Bring it up with Jacques and see how we should proceed.
